Bhagwat Gita - the Manual of Inspiring Leadership

A teacher is a role model, for his/her students. Students admire their teacher as their guide, mentor, and leader. Teachers must relate to their students with understanding, and compassion. They must be sensitive to their needs.

Every child is unique. There is an angel inside, a genius, a winner waiting to be freed. No one is flawed or useless. Student is a masterpiece waiting to be set free. A little guidance, a little extra help from the teacher can make the students excel in their performance Right motivation can bring out the creative energy in the child. Mistakes must be treated as opportunities for self-improvement. Remember there is a Chandra Gupta, Vivekananda, Kalam hidden in every child. Teacher has to act like his/her Chankya, Ramkrishna Paramhansa, or Vikram Sarabhai, to bring out the hidden creativity in the learner.

Teachers are the inspirational leaders who have the power to transform the lives of the young learners, the power to help them to realize their true potential and go on and make a positive difference in the world.

Let us turn to the greatest teacher humankind has know, the जगत्गुरु, Teacher of teachers Sri Krishna who shook Arjun out of his despondency, despair & confusion, resurrected his shattered personality, and guided him to walk on the path of virtue and dharma.

The Gita is the Universal text now interpreted in the light of modern thoughts and modern needs. It teaches us the leadership traits of courage and compassion. It provides an alternative to conventional leadership. It talks about leadership by inspiration as opposed to leadership by control.

The Bhagwad Gita gives us a clear vision of the ultimate goal in life:

When Arjuna saw his relatives, elders and teachers, the great warrior broke down in the battlefield, totally confused and deluded, refusing to fight. Arjuna surrenders and seeks the

guidance of Sri Krishna whose teachings are contained in the 18 chapters of the Bhagwad Gita Sri Krishna asks Arjuna to pursue his call of duty and to walk on the righteous path, and not to renounce the society. Krishna makes it clear that nothing is higher than a war against evil and successfully convinces Arjuna to fight the battle of Kurushetra.

Gita teaches us not to run away from our duty but make our work imbibed with spiritual consciousness. Krishna pulls Arjuna out of the mental and psychological turmoil revives his falling spirit reeducates him, so that he is able to perform his duty as a warrior.

The Bhagwad Gita tells us not to run away from challenges but remain calm in crisis, fearless in fear, and composed in every situation. This indeed is the core principle of great leadership. The fundamental insights of Gita can especially help leaders to respond to adversity with maturity and wisdom. The Gita tells us to choose the right response during crisis.

Leadership implies the ability to take people out of tense situations; out of darkness of worry and anxiety and make them experience hope, positivity & abundance of life. A true leader is a spiritual leader who remains resolute under all circumstances. He leads by example, through his personal strength, virtue & spirituality inspiring others to similarly find their own fortitude and commitment to a higher purpose. Such leadership is not dependent on control, but on inspiration.

Gita teaches us our essential identity as a spiritual being, establishing a true spiritual basis for oneness and interconnection amongst all beings. Its central message o is to know your authentic Self, आत्मवान भव Self awareness helps you to know your very roots at the spiritual level. Generally people focus on external objects like position, power, ambition and achievement totally unaware of their inner Self. The Bhagwad Gita asks us to rise above false identifications, understand our true nature. I am not the body, I am not the mind, nor even the intellect. These are simply the instruments through which the Self-expresses. When I associate myself with these equipments I start making wrong identification with people or situations and become deluded like Arjun. But when one functions at the level of Self awareness, the outward activity becomes more dynamic and energized. It becomes more invested with sensitivity and insight.

The whole of Gita is about a rediscovery of the hidden potential within. Discover the divinity within. When you connect with the Divine through devotion, you invite divine grace. You will be able to provide leadership from a place of calm and peace, unaffected by changes in the external environment, just as the ocean is unaffected by the rivers & streams flowing into its water.

In the Bhagavad Gita, Krishna defines three specific disciplines that are required for effective leadership:

- Discipline of learning,
- Discipline of Speech,
- Discipline of equanimity.

All of these disciplines are important for effective leadership:

Learning indeed is a lifelong process. One has to keep pace with the new knowledge and new advancements in the field of learning. The Universe is a University. Every moment is an opportunity to grow in wisdom.

Sri Krishna says, the most important part of communication is to communicate with honesty and with respect toward others. Gita's injunctions are to speak gently and to avoid fault finding. When mature leaders speak about others, they judiciously choose words that either appreciate the manifest talents of others or kindle their potential ones.

Leaders need to inspire, guide and at times correct those whom they lead. All this requires good communication. Throughout history, reformers, revolutionaries, pioneers and other leaders have used effective communication as a central tool for actualizing their mission. Carefully

watching their words, leaders can contribute to shaping worlds, not just of their team, but also of the larger society of which they are significant parts.

The discipline of equanimity suggests that we have to keep steady composure at good and bad times. The Bhagavad Gita says that we should not be overly excited in good times and overtly depressed in bad times. Keeping a composed mindset at all times helps us to achieve more peace and happiness in our lives.

Life is full of dualities, pleasure and pain, joy and sorrow, victory and defeat will be there but all these worldly experiences are impermanent, will come and go. If we do not learn to endure them with fortitude, we will never be able to overcome them. Leader must rise above mental disturbances, attain a state of balance, uproot all negativities and show the straight and clear path to the team to move towards the goal with positive attitude.

Lord Krishna teaches us how we need to handle ourselves while engaging in the thick of activities. It is important to remain optimistic and cheerful despite odds.

Renunciation of selfishness in thought, word and action is the theme of the Bhagwad Gita. Sri Krishna says, true renunciation is one that is undertaken with courage and without selfish attachments.

Krishna also explains that shying away from one's responsibilities due to apprehension and anxiety is not a meaningful renunciation.

The Gita Destroys Self Importance and Ego:

The secret of dynamic leadership is destroying the Ego 'I' and becoming released from all limitations of material, mental, cultural and emotional conditioning. Ego is the enemy within; it is the real barrier to progress, realization and happiness.

Gita tells us to get rid of self-importance or ego अहंकार, seeing oneself as the doer not as an instrument of the higher is the root of egoism.

Oh Arjun, just become an instrument in the hands of the Lord. निमित्त मात्र भव सव्यसचिन proclaims Sri Krishna destroy the mighty ego within, who thinks I am the Doer. Let His will flow through us to the world around us.

Bhagwad Gita provides a positive vision of action. Sri Krishna explains the concept of Karmayoga which is the art of selfless action dedicated to the Lord. Result comes from the Grace of the Lord, accept it joyfully. One has to give up attachment and perform work with a balanced mind, fully of equanimity. It is necessary to give up the anxiety regarding fruits. One must act in the present moment with an inspired mind and focused attention. Secondly, intention behind the action is important. When your intention is pure and selfless, mind becomes purified.

The whole universe is inter-connected. Lord Krishna advises Arjuna to honour the principle of mutual dependence. The spirit of sharing and unconditional giving (the virtue of Yajna) is the basis on which everything in the world sustains. Cherishing each other, you shall gain the highest good, is the precious advice given by Sri Krishna.

The first lesson a leader in an organization needs to learn to be successful is the value of mutual dependence. People working with the leader are as important as the leader.

History is a witness to many leaders who have conquered great lands, won great victories yet their lives have been meaningless and destructive. Lord is teaching that the only 'Kingdom' you can really conquer is your own 'Kingdom' within yourself. This means attaining more wisdom about your dharma, your duty, your divine calling and yourself.

Power, position, wealth all these come and go. The only thing which is eternal, permanent and timeless is that which belongs to the higher sphere of consciousness. When you are free of the ego of being the winner of the battle, then only you become the real winner in the battle of life.

Our Headmistress Mrs. Vibha Srivastava ma'am concluded that joyous event by offering her vote of thanks to all the dignitaries and the parents.






Disciplining with the Language Love

"You NEVER listen to me!" "Don't touch this!" "Don't bother me!" "No."

The above examples literally scream 'Negative Disciplining'. The sentences that begin or centre on a defeatist approach can only make our children focus on the bleaker words, as they are the ones spoken overstretched, overstressed and ridden with anger.

No, NEVER DON'T lead a child to remember and recall these words only, which does not solve the purpose of disciplining. On the contrary, these words make them wonder 'why not? This 'why not' makes them curious and as a consequence ultimately pushes them to do exactly what they are not supposed to.

The negative disciplining also brings about negative tendencies in the tender minds of little kids. As a result the leaning towards a positive growth is stunted from the very beginning.

The children do not only need to know what is wrong and right, what is good and bad, what to do and what not to do but also the basis and ground for such directions.

Another erroneous method of disciplining a child is threat laden words.

"If you don't eat I will tell Papa"

"If you do not sleep Wee Willy Winkie will take you away."

Here, we are just inducing fear in the child's vulnerable mind and heart space. A space that can store unlimited love, optimism, care and hope, is rudely shoved, with warnings and punishments.

The best and the only way to discipline a child is to bestow on them lots of love and positive endorsements.

You should sleep now so that you may regain you may regain your energy for a wonderful tomorrow." Only a little change here and there can make You life easy and You child's life worth its toils.

Discipline keeps you growing but above all it is the motivation that keeps you going.

PHONICS: A valuable tool for Reading skills' development amongst little ones!

A child spends 900 hours at school and 7800 hours at home annually. Thus the parents are the biggest influencer for the child. Reading aloud builds a child's "wants" to read. Phonics helps kids read better by teaching them how to sound out words. At the same time it makes them better spellers as they learn how letters and sounds work together.



Phonics is useful in understanding more words for kids and uses them in the field of reading and writing. In this way a bigger vocabulary is built. When they are good at phonics, they can read more smoothly which makes it easier to understand what they read. Thus comprehension becomes fun. In early education teaching phonics is crucial as it lays the foundation for reading and writing. It enables them to decode words.

Phonics enhances literacy skills, promotes comprehension and fosters a love for language and literature. Parents and teachers play significant role in a child's education and learning phonics can help them in their reading development.
